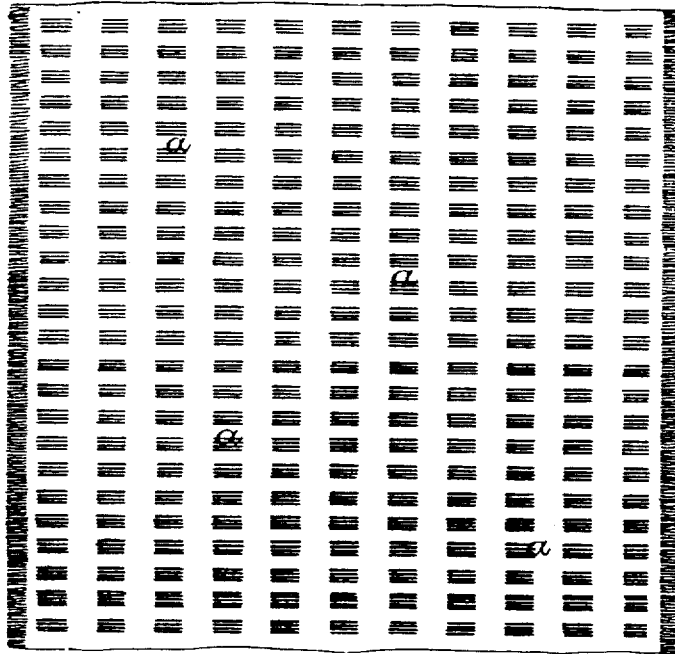

DESIGN FOR TOILET-COVER, COUNTERPANE, &c.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,785**, dated August 20, 1878; application filed April 25, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN CROSSLEY, of Heywood, in the county of Lancaster, in the Kingdom of Great Britain, have invented a Design for Toilet-Covers, Counterpanes, and similar woven goods, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying drawing, which represents sufficient of the fabric to illustrate my design, *a a* represent a series of rectangular spots arranged on the groundwork in parallel rows throughout the face of the fabric, straight bands of ground color being left between each row of spots, substantially in the manner shown.

I claim as my invention—

The within-described design for a toilet-cover, counterpane, or similar fabric, consisting of rectangular spots *a*, arranged on the groundwork in parallel rows throughout the face of the fabric, straight bands of ground color being left between each row, substantially as shown and set forth.
