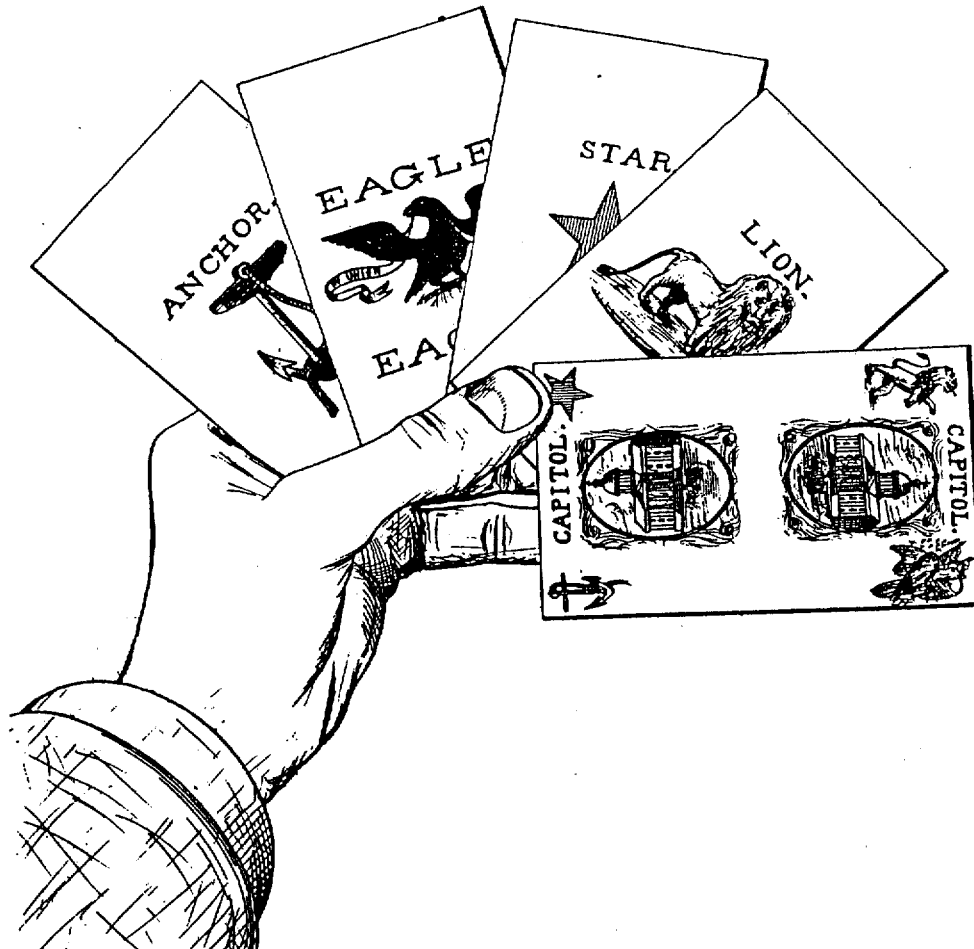

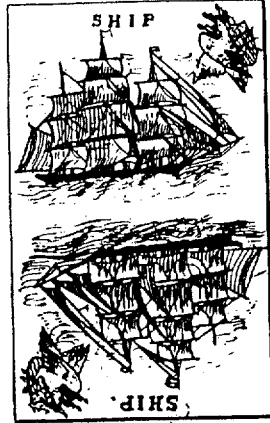
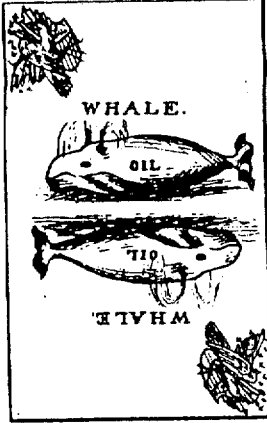

DESIGN FOR PLAYING-CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,789**, dated August 27, 1878; application filed July 13, 1878.
[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN W. NUNEN, of the city of Charleston, in the State of South Carolina, have originated a new Design for Playing-Cards, of which the following is a clear and exact description, reference being had to accompanying drawings, making a part of this specification.

My playing-cards consist in four suits, marked, respectively, with the figure of an anchor, an eagle, a star, and a lion, as shown on Sheet 1 of the drawings. The cards shown on said Sheet 1 are intended to serve as the aces or highest cards of their respective suits, while the card added thereto, and representing the capitol building, serves as the imperial or euchre card in the game known as "railroad euchre."

Each suit of cards has fourteen-spot or pip cards, including the ace, and, in addition thereto, a president, a Goddess of Liberty, a general, a flag of United States, a globe, a ship,

and a whale, the last seven of which are illustrated upon Sheet 2 of the drawings.

Suitable colors should be employed to produce an agreeable and harmonious effect.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a pack of playing-cards, in which the suits are represented by an anchor, an eagle, a star, and a lion, and the court-cards by pictures representing a president of the United States, and a general, the Goddess of Liberty, the flag of the United States, a globe, a ship, and a whale, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying drawing.
