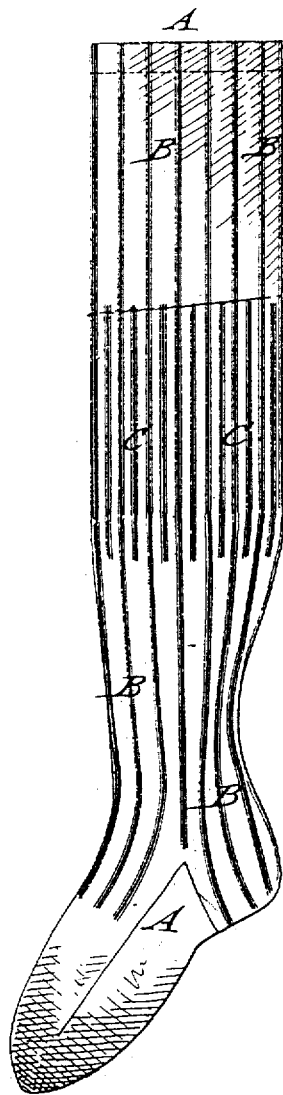
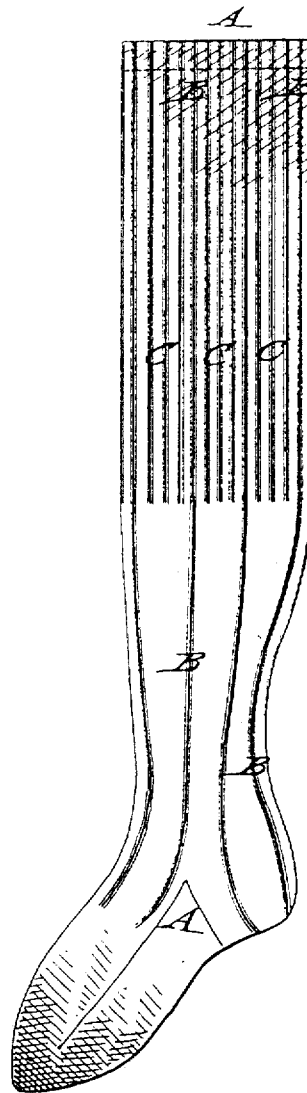

DESIGN FOR STOCKING.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,797**, dated September 10, 1878; application filed August 2, 1878.
[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT M. APPLETON, of Lake Village, in the county of Belknap and State of New Hampshire, have invented a new and original Design for Stockings, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully represented in the accompanying drawing, in which Figures 1 and 2 are side views of a stocking with slightly varying designs.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

In the drawing, A represents a stocking for ladies' use that exemplifies my design. One set of the tucks, B, runs up from the heel through

the ankle and entire length of the stocking, while another set of tucks, C, commences at the turn of the calf, and runs intermediately toward the top of the stocking, thus producing a new and beautiful style for ladies' wear.

I am aware that neither of these sets of tucks is, separately, new; but

What I claim is—

A design for ladies' stockings, consisting of the tucks B and C, the latter running between the former, as shown and described.
