

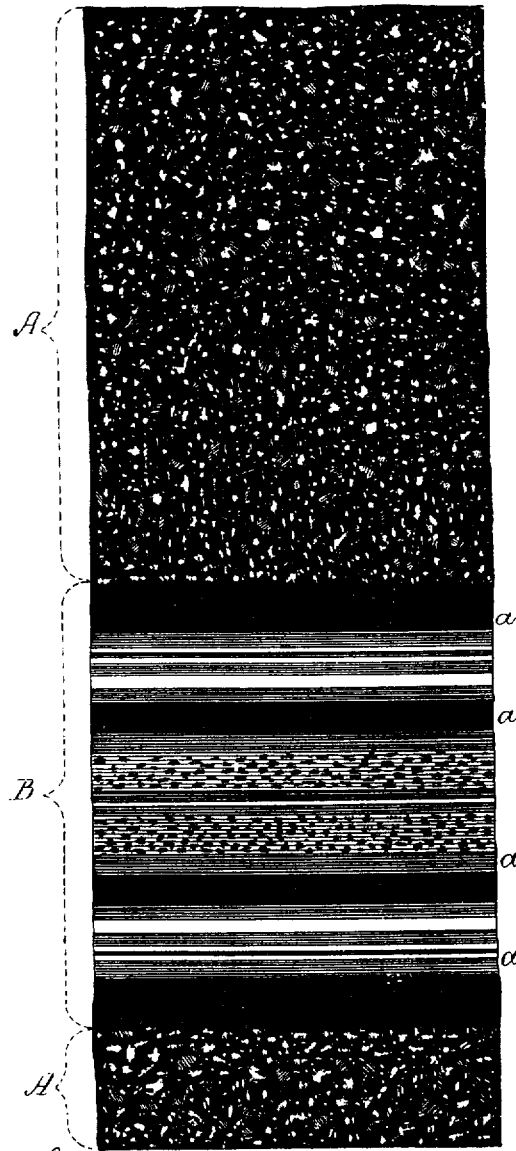

HENRY GALASHAN, OF PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA.

DESIGN FOR A SKIRT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,805**, dated September 10, 1878; application filed August 1, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY GALASHAN, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Woven Skirt, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing; and consists of two essential parts—the body A and the stripe B near the edge of the same. The body A has a plain ground, ornamented with thickly-clustered spots of different colors. The stripe B consists of a number of parallel bands, *a*. The pattern of the stripe may, however, be modified without affecting the general character of the de-

sign, the essential point being that there shall be a proper contrast between the same and the body.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—
The design for a woven skirt, comprising the spotted body A and the stripe B, substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
