DESIGN FOR GAS-MAKING STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,824, dated September 10, 1878; application filed August 10, 1878.

[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES R. VAILLANT, of Mobile, in the county of Mobile and State of Alabama, have invented a new and original Design for Gas-Making Stove, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is fully shown in the accompanying photographic illustration,

to which reference is made.

The object of this invention is to furnish an improved design for an ornamental stove or casing for a machine for making gas from rosin, so that the machine may be set up in churches, hotels, court-houses, fair-grounds, and other public and private places; and the invention consists of the design for a stove or casing, consisting of an oblong base, of a hexagonal middle part, and of an oblong top part.

Referring to the illustration, A represents the oblong base part of my casing or stove for

a gas-making machine, which rests on legs applied to the corners. From the base portion, which contains the ash-box, bulges out the hexagonal middle portion, B, of the stove, into which the retort is placed. On the top of the middle hexagonal portion rests an oblong top part, C, of less length, but greater height, than the base. The whole forms a plain but ornamental casing or jacket for inclosing the different parts of a machine for making illuminating-gas from rosin.

I claim as my invention—

The design for a casing or stove for a gasmaking machine, consisting of an oblong base, of a hexagonal middle portion, and of an oblong top, substantially as shown and described. CHARLES R. VAILLANT.
