

JOHN COCHRANE, JR., OF MALDEN, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR A PATTERN FOR ORNAMENTING FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,826, dated September 10, 1878; application filed August 9, 1878. [Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN COCHRANE, Jr., of Malden, in the county of Middlesex, State of Massachusetts, have originated and designed a pattern for ornamenting fabrics for bed-quilts and other purposes where a patchwork pattern is desired, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, which illustrates the nature of my design.

The blocks A, constituting my design, are composed of four triangular pieces arranged to form central squares, B, and twelve triangular pieces arranged around such central squares, so as to form a hollow square of interlocking triangular pieces constituting borders for the central squares. The adjacent three-cornered figures have different ground-patterns of different or contrasting colors.

The object of the design is to produce, in

long lengths, printed goods or fabrics which may be readily employed for patch-work quilts, by seaming such lengths together at their selvage edges.

The blocks, squares, and subdivisions may be of various sizes, colors, and patterns, according to fancy and the extent of contrast desired.

I claim—

The design for fabrics, composed of a central square, made up of four triangular pieces, and a square border therefor, made up of twelve triangular pieces, arranged as shown, the several pieces being of different or contrasting colors and patterns, substantially as described.
