

## DESIGN FOR LEG-FRAMES OF SEWING-MACHINES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,829, dated September 17, 1878; application filed August 25, 1876. [Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDSON S. JONES, of the city and county of Providence, and State of Rhode Island, have invented a new and useful Design for a Sewing-Machine Leg; and I do hereby declare that the following specification, taken in connection with the drawing making a part of the same, is a full, clear, and

exact description thereof.

The general outline of the leg herein de-The general outline of the leg herein described is that of a harp, having a scroll-base, A, upon which rests the body or belly B. This body is in the form of a circle, and from it arise converging arms C C', which terminate in scrolls D D', the said arms being connected at their tops by a head-piece, E, which furnishes a bed for the wood table-top placed thereon. An upright dart-shaped bar, F, rises centrally from the body B, and is intersected by a cross-bar. G. which connects the arms C by a cross-bar, G, which connects the arms C

C', the said bars being ornamented at their intersection by a rosette, a. A distinctive feature is given to the design by introducing into the circular body B a panel or frame, H, which incloses the word "Household," as shown, although any other word, as a name applied to the machine, may be used.

What I claim is—

The design for a sewing machine leg, consisting of a scroll-base, A, circular body B, converging arms C C', terminating in scrolls D D', head-piece E, bars F and G, and frame H, inclosing the word "Household," or other word or words, the whole producing the ornamental effect subsequent resented in the drawing.
