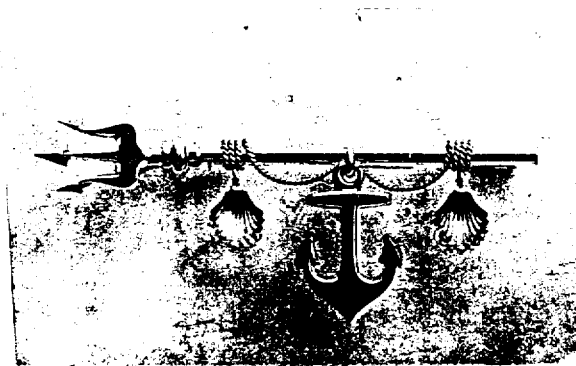

## DESIGN FOR A BROOCH.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,842**, dated September 24, 1878; application filed August 23, 1878.  
[Term of patent  $3\frac{1}{2}$  years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, HIRAM HOWARD, of the city, county, and State of New York, have originated a Design for a Brooch; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part of this specification.

A represents a trident, from the handle of which are suspended the following decorations: a pendent anchor, B, in the middle of the handle; pendent shells C, placed at or nearly at equal distances from the extremities of said handle; and the representation of a pendent festooned cord, the said cord passing through the ring *d'* of the anchor B, and coiling around the handle of the trident A at the places where the said shells are suspended from or attached to the said handle or coils of cord which encircle said handle.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. The design for a brooch, consisting of the trident A and pendent anchor B, at or near the center of the trident, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photograph.

2. The design for a brooch, consisting of the trident A and pendent shells C, at or nearly at equal distances from the extremities of the handle of the trident, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photograph.

3. The design for a brooch, consisting of the trident A, shells C, at or nearly at equal distances from the extremities of the handle of the trident, and festooned cord D, looped up in the middle to form festoons, and coiled about the handle at each end, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photograph.

4. The design for a brooch, consisting of the trident A, central pendent anchor, B, shells C C, and festooned cord D, extending between the shells coiled about the handle, and passed through the ring *d'* of the anchor, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photograph.
