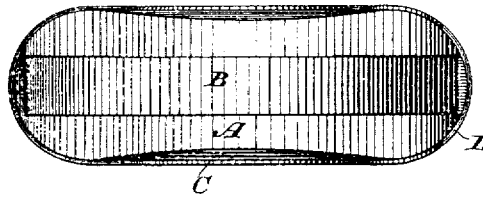

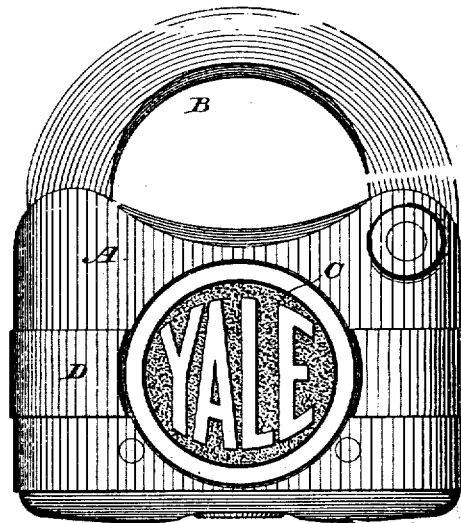
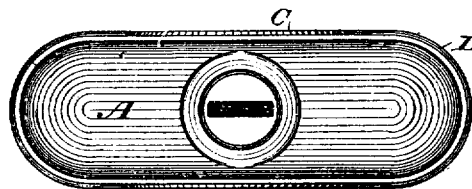

DESIGN FOR PADLOCKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,843**, dated September 24, 1878; application filed July 26, 1878.
[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, HENRY R. TOWNE and WARREN H. TAYLOR, of Stamford, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have produced a new and original Design for Padlocks, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying drawing illustrates our design, which comprehends the external case and hasp of a padlock of substantially the form and ornamentation shown.

A indicates the body of the lock-case, with its sides about parallel, its upper end slightly concave, and its lower end slightly convex in outline. B indicates the curvilinear hasp, C a medallion, and D a representation of a band encircling the lock-case. The width and height of the band may be varied without departing essentially from our design. The diameter of the medallion, which cannot be very great within the dimensions of a padlock, may also be varied in like manner, and the medallion may, as is usual, have stamped upon it letters, words, figures, or small pictures, or it may be left plain, according to taste or fancy. We may sometimes duplicate the medallion—that is to

say, place a medallion on each side—where the use of the lock will be such as to expose both sides to view, or we may form it only on one side in cases where the use of the lock will be likely to expose but one side to view, the appearance of the lock, due to the general outline shown, when provided with an encircling band and central medallion or medallions, being of the essence of our design without regard to the minute matters of variation referred to.

What we claim as our production is—

The design for a padlock of substantially the outline shown, provided with a band and medallion, substantially as described.
