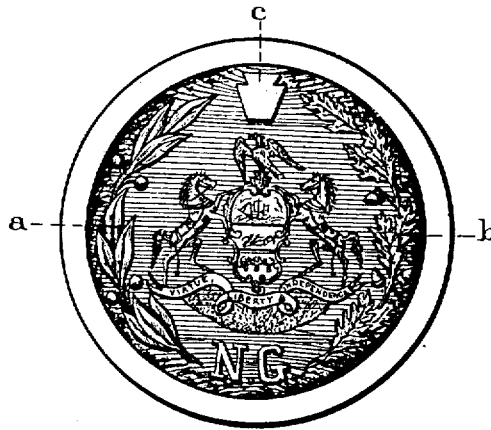

DESIGN FOR BUTTONS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,845**, dated September 24, 1878; application filed September 6, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES H. WILSON, of the city and county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have originated a Design for Buttons, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My invention consists of the design for a button, on the face whereof are the following characteristics: The coat of arms of the State of Pennsylvania, with an olive-branch, *a*, and an oak-branch, *b*, on opposite sides thereof, a

key-stone, *c*, above, and, if desired, the initials "N. G." below, the button being for military purposes.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for the face of a button, consisting of the coat of arms, as described, in the center, the oak-branch *b* and the olive-branch *a* on the right and left thereof, and the key-stone *c* at top, substantially as specified.
