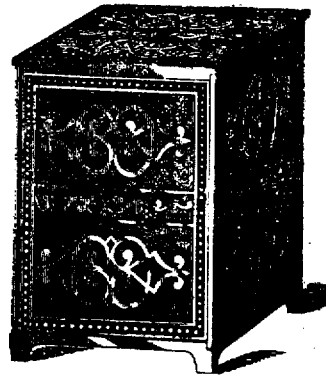

DESIGN FOR TOY MONEY-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,851**, dated October 1, 1878; application filed June 24, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AUGUSTUS E. TAYLOR, have originated and produced a new and original Design for a Toy Safe, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying engraving, making part of this specification.

The general form of the safe represents in miniature the box form of safe commonly found in business offices. The top and sides are bordered by a double ledge, with a row of small rounded elevations between the bars which constitute said double ledge. Two transverse ledges or bars extend across the middle of the sides and top, dividing each of them into two panels. Between these middle transverse bars there is ornamental scroll-work in relief. The sunken ground or face of the panels I ornament with intersecting relief ornaments.

I claim as my invention—

1. The design for a toy safe consisting of the double panels having the double ledge, with interspersed row of rounded elevations, and the middle transverse bars, with ornamental relief-work between said transverse bars, substantially as shown.

2. The design for a toy safe consisting of panels having the double ledge, with interspersed row of rounded elevations, and the space inclosed by said ledge, with intersecting ornamental relief work, substantially as shown.
