DESIGN FOR RUBBER BOOTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,856**, dated October 1, 1878; application filed September 21, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH BANIGAN, of Providence, in the county of Providence and State of Rhode Island, have invented certain new and useful Designs for Rubber Boots; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full, clear, and exact description of the invention, such as will enable others skilled in the art to which it pertains to make and use it, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, which forms part of this specification.

My invention relates to an improved design for rubber boots; and it consists in the peculiar design that will be more fully described hereinafter, whereby the appearance of the boot is greatly beautified and rendered more attractive in appearance.

The accompanying drawing represents my invention.

a represents a rubber boot, the leg portion being made of rubber, having a dull dead

color, while the foot, in whole or in part, is made of bright black or varnished rubber, so as to present a contrast between the two parts. Impressed in the surface of the leg are short lines, arranged in groups of two or more, and running at right angles to each other, as shown, thereby giving a very novel and pretty effect. This lined surface will be made, in some cases, to extend down over a portion of the top of the foot portion.

Having thus described my invention, I claim—

The design for rubber boots, as shown and described.
