

DESIGN FOR CLOCK-FRONTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,857, dated October 1, 1878; application filed September 24, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY R. FRISBIE, of Bridgeport, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and original Design for Clock-Fronts; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part of this specification.

The general form of the front is that of a flat plate, having an arched top, straight vertical sides, and an inverted arched bottom, with pedestals at the lower corners for the support of the same. The arched top is ornamented by an arched molding, A. The inverted arched bottom is ornamented with an arched molding, B. The arched molding A, at the top, is decorated by a series of Moresque ornaments in relief, (indicated at k,) which ornaments extend along the front of said molding, except in the middle of the same, which is occupied by the representation of a key-stone, L, decorated with the letters "E. N. W." arranged in a fanciful monogram on its front, and a trefoil, m, surmounted by a ring, n, on the top.

The pedestals D are decorated with reliefmoldings f and relief-panels g g'. The intermediate part of the front R is decorated by Moresque ornaments h at the lower corners, by side moldings C, by a circular series of truncated pyramids, i, around the dial, said pyramids having convex tops, and by spandrels or arched panels j in the upper corners.

I claim—

The design for a clock-front, herein described, consisting of the arched molding A, ornamented with Moresque ornaments k, the key-stone L, the pedestals D, ornamented with relief-moldings f and relief-panels g g', the inverted arched molding B, and the part intermediate between said moldings decorated with Moresque ornaments h i j and the side moldings C, substantially as herein described, and as shown in the photographic illustration.
