DESIGN FOR CLOCK-FRONTS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,858, dated October 1, 1878; application filed September 24, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY R. FRISBIE, of Bridgeport, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have invented a new and Original Design for Clock-Fronts; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part of this specification.

The design consists as follows: The base consists of a bar, A, pedestals or feet C, and forward-projecting extensions B, which connect the bar A with the rest of the front of the alack-case in such manner that the bar A stands in a position sinterior to the rest of the design, as shown in the photographic illustration.

The sides each consist of a bar having a square loop, D, at its lower part, said loop being joined to the forward-projecting extensions B, situated at the extremities of the bar A, a straight intermediate part, E, a square loop, F, at the upper part, curved braces connecting, respectively, the upper part of the lower loop, D, with the straight part E, and the lower part of the loop F with the said

straight part and a finial, H, at the top. Said sides are laterally connected with the rest of the design on their inner sides by intermediate angular pieces.

The central part, P, which is to contain the dial, is ornamented in relief with Moresque ornaments, J, in relief, on a ground-work, J', representing wicker-work, above and below the dial of the clock, and surmounted with an arched molding, K, with a central finial, L, said arch being joined to the portion of the design below it by radial pieces M, as shown in the photographic illustration.

I claim—

The design for a clock-front consisting of the base A B C, side pieces E F G H, central part P, ornamented in relief by the Moresque ornaments J and representation of wickerwork J', and the arched molding K, having the central finial L, substantially as herein specified, and as shown in the photographic illustration.
