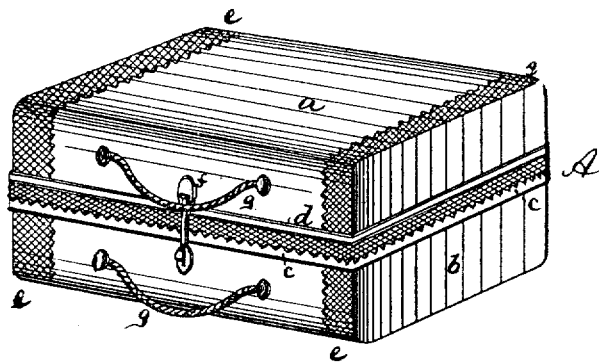

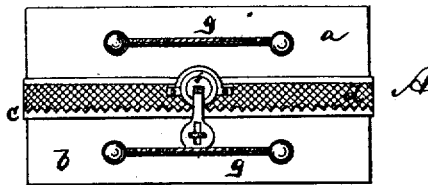
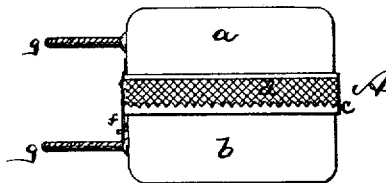

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,863**, dated October 8, 1878; application filed September 23, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Be it known that I, ADOLPH MOONELIS, of New York city, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Cigar-Box, of which the following is a specification :

This invention relates to a new design for a cigar-box; and consists in the new configuration and ornamentation of the box, as is hereinafter fully pointed out.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 is a perspective view of my newly-designed cigar-box. Fig. 2 is a face view, and Fig. 3 an end view, of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts in all the figures.

The letter A represents the newly-designed cigar-box. The same is made of wood, leather, or other material, and has the form approximately of a trunk. The box A is composed of two halves or parts, *a* and *b*, which are made

of about the same size and form, and of which the part *a* serves as a cover, while the part *b* forms the body of the box. The parts *a* *b* are connected by a suitable joint. At the upper edge of the lower half, *b*, there is a band, *c*, which projects above such edge, and which is ornamented by a border, *d*, having a zigzag edge, as shown. Similar borders *e* are applied at both sides of the box and extend entirely around the same. At the front the box A is ornamented by a small lock, *f*, and handles *g* *g*, as shown.

I claim—

The design for a cigar-box, substantially as shown.
