

## DESIGN FOR HINGES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,864, dated October 8, 1878; application filed September 12, 1878. [Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES B. CLARK, of Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Hinges, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, mak-

ing part of this specification.

The letter A represents the wings or baseplates of the hinge, carrying respectively the eye and pintle portions of the same. The said wings or base-plates are formed with a raised ornamental border, D, around their edges. Said wings or base-plates are also formed with horizontal upper and lower edges E, at the outer extremities of which are formed shoulders F, from which the said wings or base-plates are curved, as shown at G, the curves extending to and forming the vertical outer edge of said wing or base-plate.

The eye or female portion of the hinge is formed with a raised bead or depressed groove, H, constituting the outline of a rhombus or

lozenge.

By means of the configuration given to the wings or base-plates and eye portion of the hinge a highly-ornamental hinge is produced, which is attractive when in position, and sets off and gives a superior finish to the blinds of a building.

What Ĭ claim is—

A design for a hinge, in which the wings or base-plates are provided with a raised border, D, at their edges, the said wings having upper and lower horizontal edges E, at the outer extremities of which are formed square shoulders F, from which the said wings or baseplates are curved outwardly, the curves running into the vertical outer edges of said wings, substantially as shown and described.
