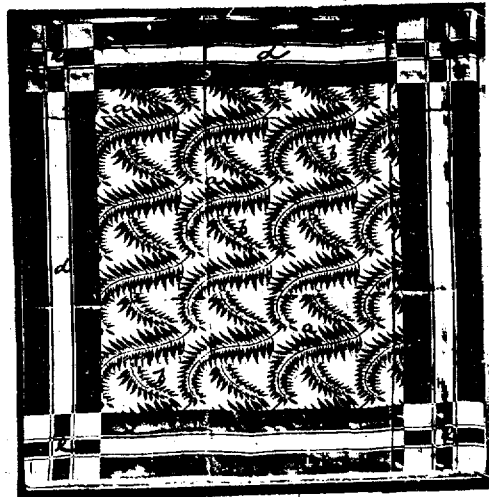

DESIGN FOR HANDKERCHIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,866**, dated October 15, 1878; application filed September 10, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN GRIMSHAW, of Paterson, county of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for a Handkerchief, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

The invention consists, first, in the representation of peculiar fern-leaves on the body of a handkerchief; second, in the design for the border, and also in the entire design, all as hereinafter described.

The fern-leaves *a* are arranged in rows, all their points turning the same way, on the body of the handkerchief. Between the rows of larger fern-leaves, *a*, there are rows of smaller

fern-leaves, *b*, as shown. The points of the fern-leaves *b* are turned in the same direction as the points of the fern-leaves *a*.

The border is composed of the straight lines *c* and *d* at the sides, and of the checkered figures *e* in the corners of the border.

I claim—

1. The design for the body of a handkerchief, substantially as shown.
2. The design for the border of a handkerchief, substantially as shown.
3. The design for a handkerchief, substantially as shown.
