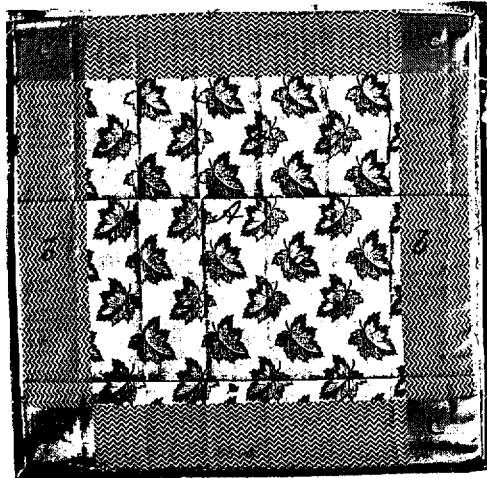

DESIGN FOR HANDKERCHIEF.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,867**, dated October 15, 1878; application filed September 10, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN GRIMSHAW, of Paterson, county of Passaic, and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for Handkerchiefs, of which the following is a specification:

The accompanying photograph illustrates my new design.

The invention consists, first, in the new ornamentation of the body of a handkerchief; second, in the new border of the handkerchief, and also in the entire design, all as hereinafter described.

The body A of the handkerchief contains representations of maple-leaves *a* arranged on a mottled surface in straight rows, the points of the leaves in one row being turned in an opposite direction to the points of those in the next row.

The border of the handkerchief is composed of zigzag lines *b*, which extend between the several corners of the body of the handkerchief, as shown, square corner-pieces, made up of fine diagonal lines *c*, being interposed between the zigzag border *b*.

I claim—

1. The design for the body A of a handkerchief, substantially as shown.
2. The design for the border *b c* of a handkerchief, substantially as shown.
3. The design for a handkerchief, substantially as shown.
