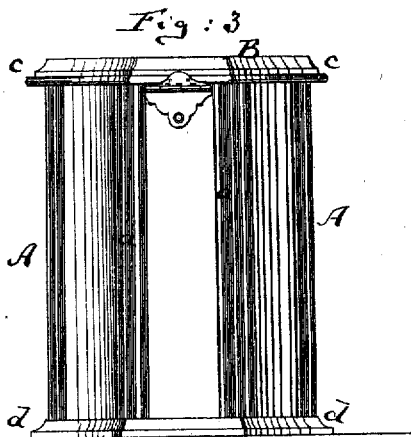
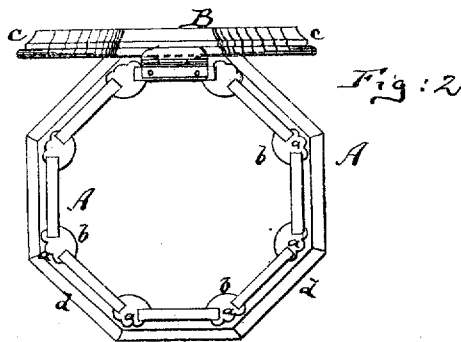
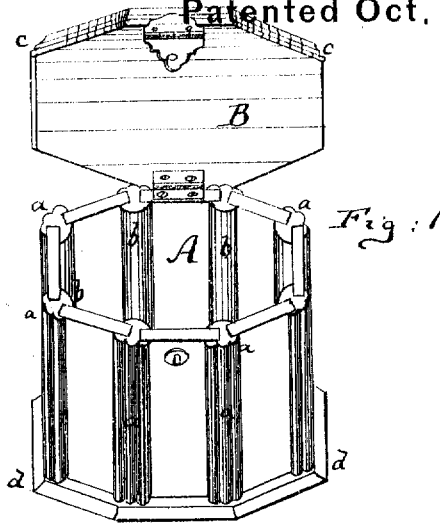

## DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOX.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,873**, dated October 22, 1878; application filed September 28, 1878.  
[Term of patent 7 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, EMIL HANTSCHE, of New York city, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Cigar-Box, of which the following is a specification:

Figure 1 is a perspective view of my new cigar-box. Fig. 2 is a top view, and Fig. 3 a front view, of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts in all the figures.

This invention relates to a new configuration of cigar-box.

The box A is of octagonal form, and has three bead moldings, *a a*, extending vertically

along each outer angle. A rounded bead, *b*, extends vertically along each inner angle, as shown. The lid B is of corresponding octagonal form, and has its edge *c* formed into ornamental moldings, as shown. The base or bottom *d* of the box projects beyond the walls thereof, as indicated.

I claim—

The design for a cigar-box, substantially as shown.
