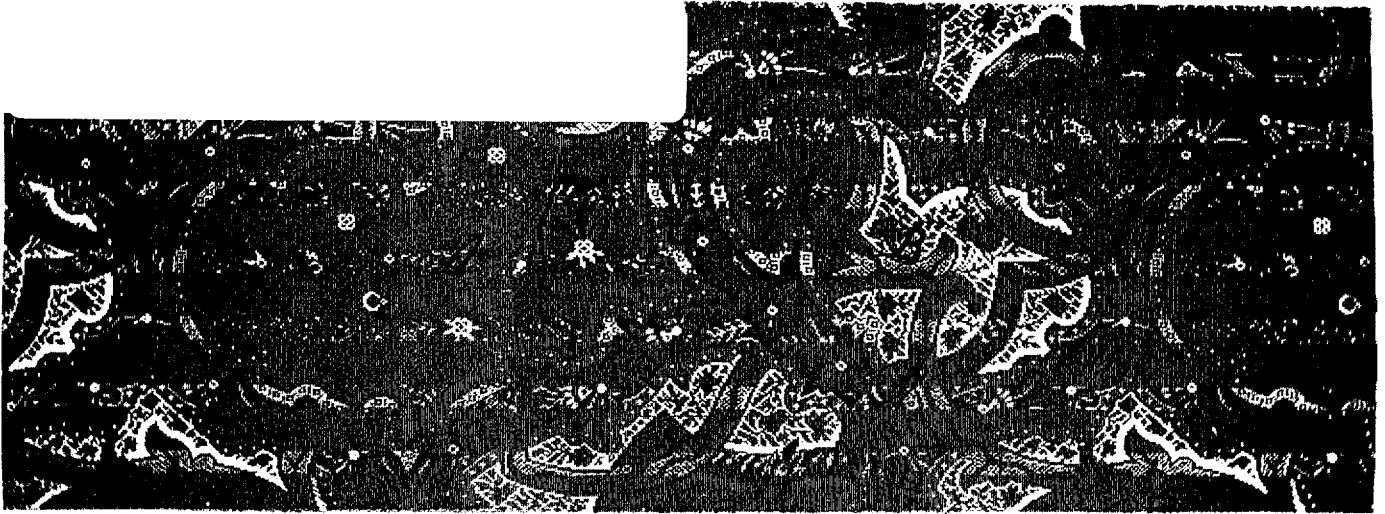

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,875**, dated October 22, 1878; application filed October 2, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN NEIL, of New York city, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification:

This invention relates to a new and original design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists in the new configuration and ornamentation of parts, hereinafter more fully pointed out.

In the photographic illustration, which represents a face view of my newly-designed carpet, the letter A represents an irregular shield-shaped figure surrounded by a border, and embellished by the representation of floral ornamentations.

B is a heart-shaped figure, which is separated from the shield A by a wide border, *a*, containing a garland of flowers. A branch of this garland extends also partly around the shield A. The heart-shaped figure B is intersected by a number of arcs, *b b*, which are irregularly arranged, and are preferably of different colors. The figure B is also preferably made in two colors, and ornamented by several smaller fanciful figures.

I claim—

The design for a carpet, substantially as shown.
