

## DESIGN FOR PADLOCKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,877, dated October 22, 1878; application filed October 11, 1878.

[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN GÉRARD, of Trenton, New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for a Padlock, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a padlock is fully shown in the accompanying drawings, of which—

Figure 1 represents a front view, and Fig.

2 a rear view, of the lock.

The prominent feature of the front of the lock is the representation of a face surrounding the key-hole, and the prominent feature of the rear of the lock is the representation of the hind quarters of an animal projecting from an opening.

Both the front and rear of the lock have minor ornamentation, which it is not necessary to particularly describe, as it forms no essential part of the design, and may be varied as taste may suggest.

The character of the face and of the projecting hind quarters may also be varied without causing them to lose their distinguishing character.

I claim—

1. The design for the front of the padlock, said design comprising the representation of a face surrounding the key-hole, as set forth.

2. The design for the rear of the padlock, said design comprising the representation of the hind quarters of an animal projecting from an opening, as set forth.

3. The within-described design for a padlock, said design comprising on the front plate the representation of a face surrounding the key-hole, and on the rear plate the representation of the hind quarters of an animal projecting from an opening, as set forth.
