

JOSEPH HOLLELY, OF BROOKLYN, NEW YORK.

DESIGN FOR MOLDED CARDS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,879, dated October 22, 1878; application filed July 28, 1876. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH HOLLELY, of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have originated a new Design for Molded Cards; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, representing the same.

Upon a rectangular card, A, I raise or form a molding or bead, a, near the edges of the card, and parallel therewith, the molding being rounded at the corners of the card, whether the card itself is or not, as represented at b b b. This molding or bead a also curves up, as shown at c, around a suspending-hole, d, which is made in an upward projection, B, of the card, at the middle of the upper side or end of the card.

I sometimes make a second molding or bead, f, inside of the molding or bead a, and parallel with it, the corners g g g being similarly rounded; but the part which passes the

curved part c of the molding a around the suspension-hole d is straight, as shown.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. A design for a card consisting of an ornamental raised molding or bead, a, near its edges, with rounded corners b b b and curve c at one side or end, substantially as repre-

sented and described.

2. A design for a molded card consisting of an ornamental raised molding or bead, a, near its edges, with rounded corners b b b b and curve c at one side or end, and an inner molding or bead, f, with rounded corners g g g g and straight sides and ends, substantially as represented and described.
