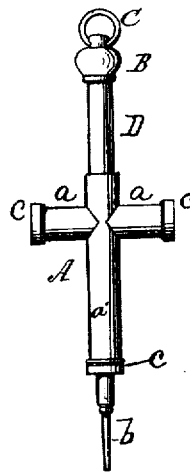

DESIGN FOR PENCIL-CASES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,880**, dated October 29, 1878; application filed October 3, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JAMES M. CLARK, of Jersey City, in the county of Hudson and State of New Jersey, have originated and designed a Pencil-Case, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

My new design relates to a pencil-case having the following configuration:

A designates a cross, the vertical portion *a'* of which is cylindrical in cross-section, and has a cylindrical portion, D, of less diameter, extending above its upper end, surmounted by a knob or spheroidal head, B, and a ring, C. The lower end of the body or portion *a'* of the cross is ornamented by an annular enlargement, *c*, and from this lower end of the portion *a'* extends a pencil-nib, *b*.

The arms *a a* of the cross are cylindrical in cross-section, and are tipped with ornaments *c c*, similar to the lower terminal ornament on the vertical portion *a'*.

The ornament B may be made of a metal having a color different from the color of the body of the cross—for instance, the crown B and the tips *c* may be made of silver and the body of the cross of gold, or of colors representing these metals.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a pencil-case consisting of the cruciform-shaped body A, having the ornaments *c c c*, and surmounted by the spheroidal ornament B, substantially as described.
