## DESIGN FOR STICK-CANDY.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,883**, dated October 29, 1878; application filed July 25, 1878.  
[Term of patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, GEORGE M. MILLS, of Philadelphia, in the county of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania, have originated and designed a novel form for Stick-Candy, of which the following is a specification:

My design consists of a stick of candy having the form in cross-section of a Maltese cross, as distinctly illustrated in the accompanying drawing, in which—

Figure 1 is an end view, Fig. 2 is a side

view, and Fig. 3 is a cross-sectional view, of a stick of candy embodying my design.

What I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The novel design consisting of a stick of candy having the form in cross-section of a Maltese cross, as shown.
