DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,888, dated October 29, 1878; application filed September 19, 1878. [Term of patent 34 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM McCALLUM, of Yonkers, in the county of Westchester and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification:

The photographic illustration represents a face view of my newly-designed carpet, and

the border for the same.

This invention relates to a new and original design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric; and consists of the new arrangement and ornamentation of figures hereinafter pointed

In the photographic illustration, the letter A represents the carpet; B, its border. The carpet A contains on a background, that is ornamented by and composed of a multitude of geometrical figures, the representation of peacock-feathers a and of several balls, b, as shown. The balls b are embellished respect-

lively, by two, four, and five smaller circles, arranged around their peripheries. The carpet is further decorated by ellipses c, branches and leaves d, and several arbitrary figures, as shown. The border B contains between two broad strips, e e, peacock-feathers a and balls b, similar to and corresponding with the design of the carpet A. The outer strip of the border contains also a series of overlapping and opposed semicircles, as shown.

I claim-

1. The design for a carpet, having feathers a and balls b, which balls are embellished by smaller circles, substantially as shown.

2. The design for a carpet, having feathers a, balls b, ellipses c, and branches and leaves d, substantially as shown.
