

DESIGN FOR CARPET.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,889**, dated October 20, 1878; application filed July 31, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDMUND PYNE, of New York city, county and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for a Carpet, of which the following is a specification:

This invention relates to a new design for a carpet, oil-cloth, or similar fabric, and the border thereof.

It consists of the new ornamentation of parts hereinafter pointed out.

The accompanying photograph illustrates

my new design.

In the photographic illustration, the letter

In the photographic illustration, the letter A represents my newly-designed carpet. B is the border thereof.

The carpet A is composed of peculiar groups, a, of flowers, the center of every such group being roses, which are surrounded by star-flowers, forget-me-nots, and fern-leaves, pertaining to the same group.

Large palm-like leaves b b constitute a second and distinct series of groups dividing the groups a. Moss is interspersed between the two groups, giving to the design a peculiar, rich, and natural effect.

The border B also contains the groups a b, but is, in addition thereto, ornamented by two parallel stripes, c d, and by a fancy margin, e. The inner line of the stripe d is undulated, each undulation embracing a rosette-like ornament, as shown.

I claim-

The design for a carpet, substantially as shown.
