## DESIGN FOR COFFIN-PLATE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,892**, dated October 29, 1878; application filed September 13, 1878.  
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ALEXIS FATOUX, of Taunton, in the county of Bristol and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and useful Design for Coffin-Plates; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, showing a face view of a coffin-plate embodying my design.

The outline of the plate A is an oblong, slightly narrowed from the corners toward the middle of the body portion *a*, and having angular or pointed ends *b b b*, of ornamental detail of configuration. On each end of the plate and extending across the same is an ornamental figure, *a'*, which has on its three outer

sides substantially the configuration of the contiguous portions of the plate.

I do not claim, broadly, a plate having broadened or fan-shaped ends; but

What I claim is—

The design for a coffin-plate in which the plate has the outline of an oblong, with the angular ends *b b b*, and is gradually narrowed from the outer angles or corners of the ends to the middle of its sides, and the ornamental figures *a' a'* extending across said ends, as shown.
