## DESIGN FOR BUST.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,893**, dated November 5, 1878; application filed October 16, 1878.  
[Term of patent 14 years.]

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, AUGUST BARTHOLDI, sculptor, of Paris, in the Republic of France, have originated a novel Design for an Ornamental Bust, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

My design consists in a bust of a female figure symbolizing Liberty and Enlightenment, as herein illustrated and described.

As shown in the annexed photographic representation, the bust terminates close below the shoulders, the arms being also removed close to the shoulders, with the right shoulder raised to nearly the utmost, the removed right arm being supposed to be raised aloft. The head is surmounted by an aureola or diadem, from which rays proceed, as shown, with the hair gathered in folds upon the brow under the diadem, and falling in ringlets upon each side behind the ears. The drapery lies in easy folds upon the chest and shoulders, fully ex-

posing the neck, and is gathered into a rosette upon the left shoulder. The face is of the Greek type, and is turned slightly to the right, the eyes having a distant gaze, and the countenance wearing a benignant expression, with an air of dignity and determination, symbolic of Liberty and Enlightenment.

The essential features constituting the design which I claim may be expressed as follows:

The female bust symbolic of Liberty and Enlightenment, having the head surmounted with an aureolar diadem, the hair gathered in folds upon the brow under the same, and falling in ringlets upon each side, with the right shoulder raised, and the drapery gathered in easy folds upon the shoulder and chest, exposing the neck, substantially as herein illustrated.
