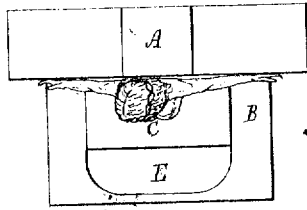

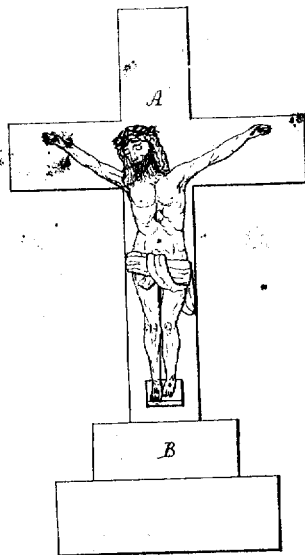
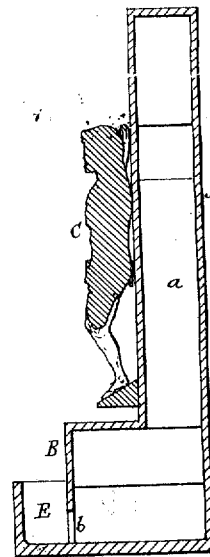

THOMAS LLOYD, OF BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR HOLY-WATER FONT.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,894**, dated November 5, 1878; application filed October 14, 1878.
[Term of patent 7 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS LLOYD, of Boston, of the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new ornamental Design for a Holy-Water Font; and do hereby declare the same to be described in the following specification and represented in the accompanying drawings, of which—

Figure 1 is a top view, Fig. 2 a front elevation, and Fig. 3 a vertical section thereof.

Such design consists of a cross and figure of the Christ the Savior thereon, a stepped base or pedestal to such cross, and a trough arranged in the said base.

In the drawings, A denotes the cross; B, the stepped pedestal or base; C, the figure of Christ; E, the trough.

What I claim is—

The design, substantially as described, for a holy-water font, it consisting in the figure, cross, stepped pedestal, and the trough, arranged as represented.
