DESIGN FOR AN ORNAMENT FOR JEWELRY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,896, dated November 5, 1878; application filed September 28, 18 [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORGE H. DRAPER, of Attleborough, Bristol county, State of Massachusetts, have originated a Design for an Ornament for Jewelry, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part of this specification.

In the drawing my design is shown enlarged

in size.

My design consists in the representation, in relief, of a human leg, fabricated of gold or baser metal, said leg being shown at A, incased to a distance above the knee in a stocking, B, which has lateral stripes b, which stripes may be effectively represented by means of enamel of various colors and tints. Upon the foot is a slipper or shoe, C, which is preferably shown in burnished or polished metal. The upper part of the leg above the stocking is shown incased in one leg of a pair of drawers, D, the embroidery on the same being

effectively produced by employing enamel, as shown at d.

The figure thus constituted I surround by a frame or rim, which conforms in outline to the outline of the leg, and the outer or exposed face or edge of this rim is polished and lustrous. This is seen at E in the drawings.

The design described and shown may be used to ornament or embellish any of the

known forms of jewelry.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for an ornamentation for jewelry, which consists in the leg A, incased in stocking B, having stripes b, and having shoe C, and drawer-leg D, together with the inclosing lustrous rim E, conforming in outline to the outline of the leg, substantially as shown and described.
