

DESIGN FOR WRITING-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,897, dated November 12, 1878; application filed October 26, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY C. BAINBRIDGE, of the city of Brooklyn, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have originated and designed a Pattern for Writing-Paper, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, making part of this specification.

The design is composed of a series of groups of irregular and various polygonal figures having salient and re-entering angles, such angles of each figure being counterparts of and matching with the angles of adjacent figures, and each figure having in its center a plain smooth surface, from which the figure is striated toward its sides and angles in the form of rays.

In the accompanying drawing several groups and portions of groups of the polygonal figures are represented, each group being in-

cluded within one of the squares indicated by straight diagonal and intersecting dotted lines *a a*, one of said groups forming the complete pattern, and the others being mere repetitions.

In some of the polygonal figures the striations are not represented in the drawing, being omitted in order to show the outline of the figures more conspicuously. The striations are, however, shown in one complete pattern and parts of adjacent ones.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for writing-paper composed of groups of irregular polygonal figures, having smooth centers and striated toward their sides and angles, substantially as herein shown and described.
