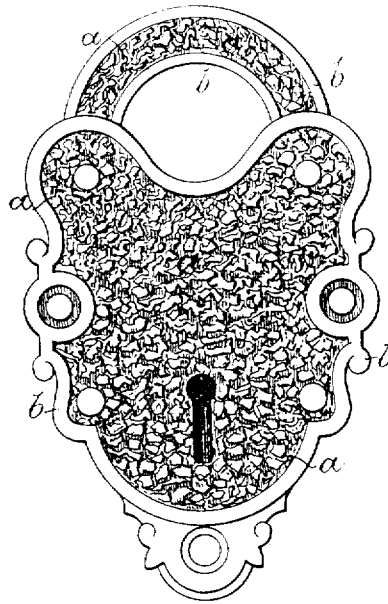

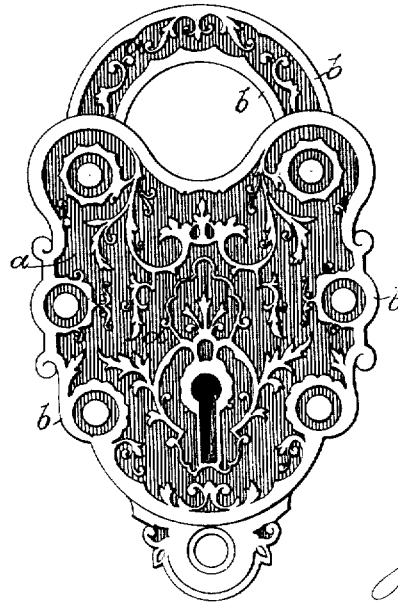

DESIGN FOR PADLOCKS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,913**, dated November 19, 1878; application filed October 11, 1878.
[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN GÉRARD, of Trenton, New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for a Padlock, of which the following is a specification:

My design for a padlock is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, in which are two views presenting the same characteristics as regards the feature which forms the subject of the design, but differing as regards minor ornamentation, which does not constitute a part of the said design, the latter consisting of a raised edging or border, *b*, following the outline of lock and shackle, and imparting a neat appearance to both.

I claim—

The design for a padlock, consisting of a plain raised border on the lock-case and shackle, and following the outline of both, as described, and as illustrated in and by the accompanying drawing.
