

DESIGN FOR A BROOCH.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,914, dated November 19, 1878; application filed October 16, 1878. [Term of patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HIRAM HOWARD, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented or originated a new Design for a Brooch; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part of this specification.

A represents a shepherd's crook, around which is entwined a vine, a a, by which are suspended from the crook a ram's head, B, Pandean pipes C, and an ancient shepherd's pipe, D, the ram's head being near the center of the crook, and the pipes on either side of it.

What I claim as my invention is—

1. The design for a brooch, consisting of the shepherd's crook A, with the vine a a entwined about it, substantially as described and shown.

2. The design for a brooch, consisting of the shepherd's crook A and the ram's head B, suspended therefrom, substantially as herein described and shown.

3. The design for a brooch, consisting of the shepherd's crook A, with Pandean pipes C and shepherd's pipe D suspended therefrom, substantially as herein described and shown.

4. The design for a brooch, consisting of the shepherd's crook A, vine a a, ram's head B, Pandean pipes C, and shepherd's pipe D, all arranged substantially as herein described and shown.
