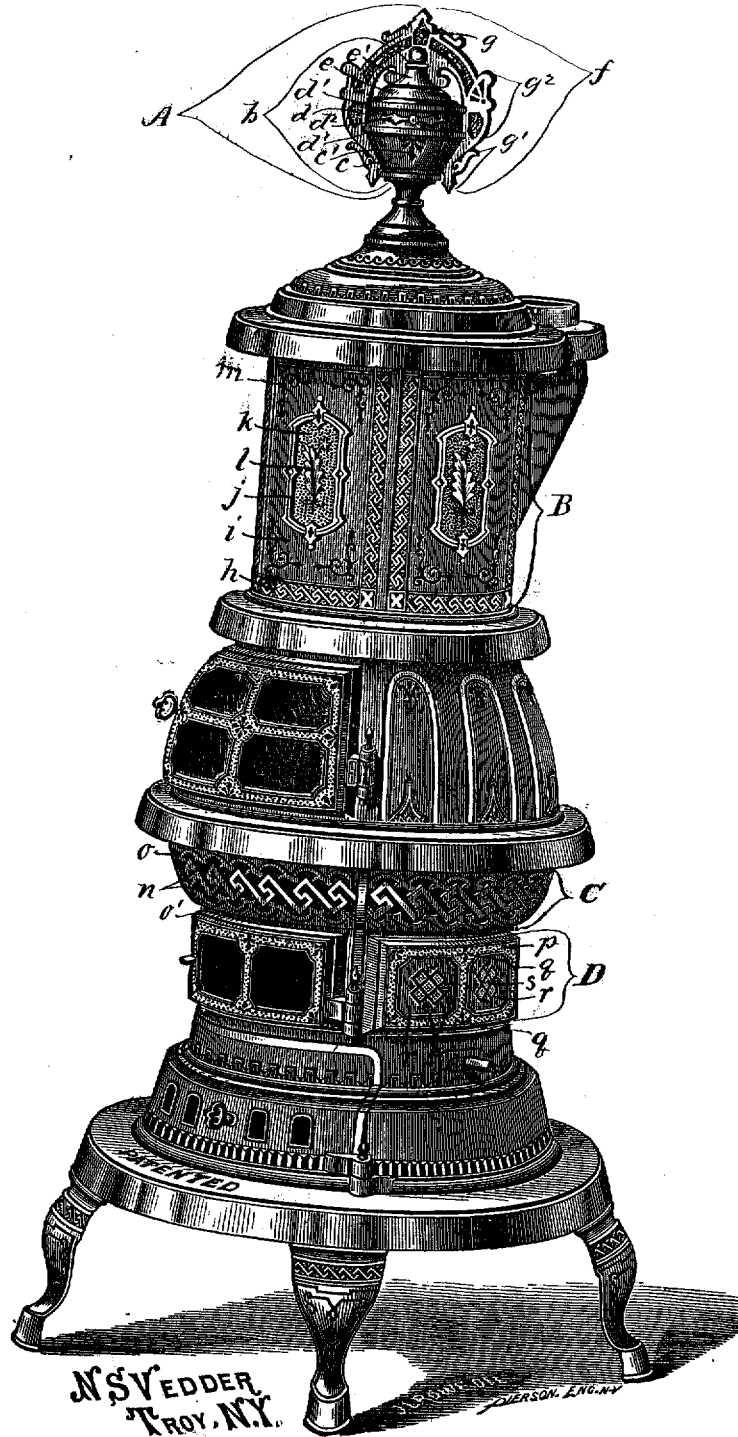

DESIGN FOR STOVES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,929**, dated November 26, 1878; application filed November 15, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, NICHOLAS S. VEDDER, of the city of Troy, in the county of Rensselaer and State of New York, and TOBIAS S. HEISTER, of the village of Lansingburg, in said county and State, have jointly invented and produced a new and original ornamental Design for Stoves, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to accompanying cut, print, or engraving of a stove having our said new design.

One part of this invention is the design for the vase A, consisting of the body *b*, having the lower tapering portion, *c*, with ornaments *c'* thereon, the middle band-like portion *d*, having upper and lower flanges, *d'*, and the intermediate ornament, *d''*, and the upper convex portion, *e*, and concave part *e'*, in connection with the arch-like crest *f*, of curved form, with top ornament, *g*, bottom ornaments, *g'*, and intermediate ornaments, *g''*, all shaped and arranged together substantially as shown in the aforesaid print.

Another part is the design for the upper section, B, consisting of the oblique, rectangular, zigzag, fillet ornamentation *h* along the borders of the panel surfaces *i*, and the internal ornamental frame-like border *j* around the inner panel surface, *k*, having thereon the leaf ornament *l*, all substantially as represented in the aforesaid engraving, with or without the corner ornaments *m*.

Another part is the design for the open-work section C, consisting of the middle se-

ries of oblique, zigzag, rectangular, fillet-bars *n*, extending across the space between, and connected to the upper and lower obliquely-scalloped ornamental border parts, *o o'*, and the whole being of downwardly-convex form, as shown in the aforesaid cut.

Another part is the design for the panel-section D, consisting of the ornamented border *p*, having the ornaments *q*, and surrounding the two quadrilateral panels *r r*, having truncate corners, and the oblique rectangular cruciform ornaments *s* in the middle, all shaped and arranged as represented in the aforesaid print.

What we claim as our invention is—

1. The design for the vase A, consisting of the parts *b c e' d d' d'' e e'* and *f g g' g''*, shaped and arranged as shown and described.
2. The design for the upper section, B, consisting of the parts *h, i, j, k*, and *l*, as described.
3. The design for the open-work section C, consisting of the parts *n o o'*, all shaped and arranged as shown and described.
4. The design for the panel-section D, consisting of the parts *p q, r r, s*, as set forth.
