DESIGN FOR A CROCHETED JACKET.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,937, dated December 3, 1878; application filed July 24, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern;

Be it known that I, John Holmes, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have produced a new Design for Crocheted Jackets, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, which fully represents the nature of my design.

This jacket has its body portion composed of wool or worsted yarn, crocheted to form the

shell-stitch.

This jacket, a short distance above its lower end, as at b, is provided with extra shells besides those in the general rows, so as to cause the lower portion of the jacket to incline or set out, to fit the hips and give shape to the waist, as at c.

At the front of the jacket, and about its en-

tire lower end, is a series of larger shells, de, connected together as a border, and each shell is pearled about its edge, as shown at f, forming a shell-like pearled border entirely about the jacket, enabling the fringe heretofore employed about the bottom of the jacket to be dispensed with.

Ĭ claim—

The design for a jacket consisting of the crocheted shell-stitch body portion and the continuous border portion of shells having pearled edges, substantially as described, and as shown in the accompanying illustration.
