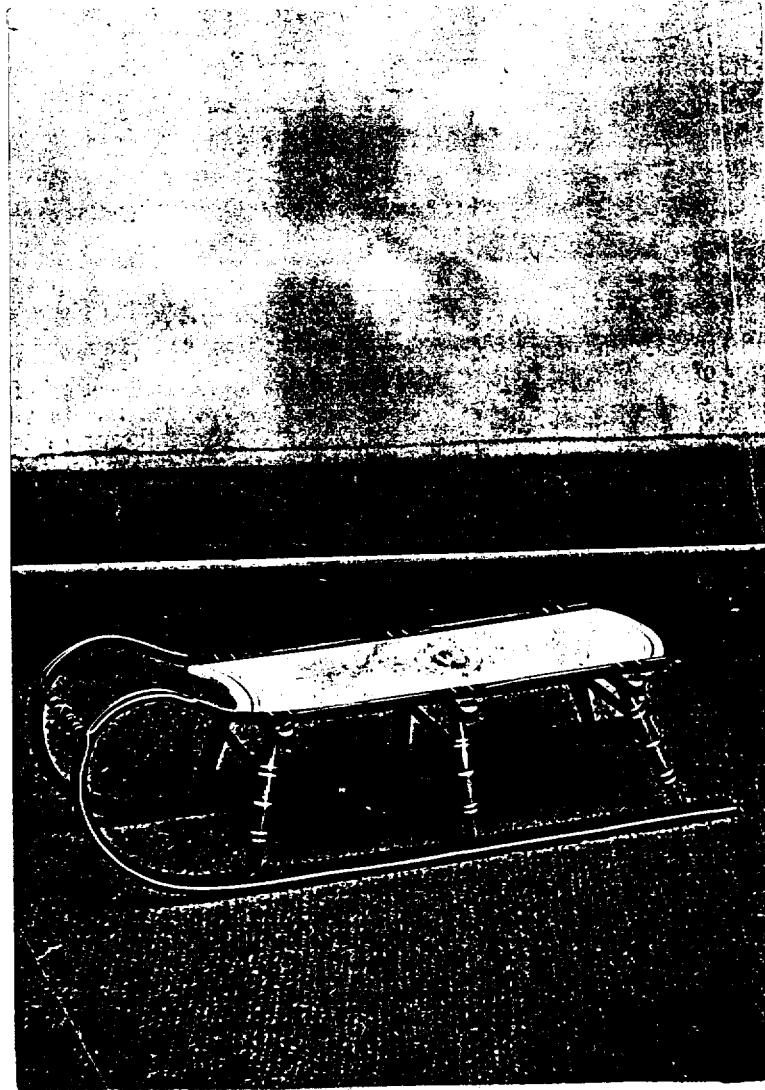

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,939**, dated December 3, 1878; application filed October 1, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ADOLPH SHOENINGER, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have originated and designed a Pattern for a Sled for Children and Youth, which is fully represented in the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, in which--

A represents the continuous runners and fenders, B the benches, C the seat-board, and d the cross-braces, all of which are shaped and

composed in such a manner as to bring about the design shown in the photographic illustration.

What I claim is--

The design for a sled, substantially as represented by the accompanying illustration.
