

JOHN GRIMSHAW, OF PATERSON, NEW JERSEY

DESIGN FOR A HANDKERCHIEF-BORDER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,944**, dated December 3, 1878; application filed November 2, 1878.

[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN GRIMSHAW, of Paterson, in the county of Passaie and State of New Jersey, have invented a new and original Design for the Border of a Handkerchief, of which the following is a description:

The nature of my invention is a design for the border of a handkerchief; and it consists, essentially, of a trunk or frame placed near the edges of the handkerchief, and which is entwined by a vine, as shown.

In the accompanying illustration, A represents a handkerchief; a, the trunk or frame, and b is the entwining vine.

I claim—

The design for the border of a handkerchief, which consists, essentially, of a trunk or frame, a, placed near the edge of the handkerchief, and vine b, entwined around such trunk, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
