DESIGN FOR A FONT OF PRINTING-TYPES.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,955**, dated December 10, 1878; application filed November 2, 1878.

[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS MACKELLAR, (assignor to MACKELLAR, SMITHS & JORDAN,) of the city and county of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Font of Printing-Types, of which the following is a specification:

The nature of my design is shown in the accompanying typographic impression, to which reference is made; and consists of a bold-face letter shaded upon the right and bottom by a lighter line.

This letter differs from the design patented by Andrew Little, February 2, 1871, No. 4,673, in that the letters of the present design are bolder-faced and more extended, that the cross-lines of the A and H are inclined and meet about centrally, that the lower portions of the M, N, V, and W are concaved, as shown, and that the tail of the Q is curved and presents the appearance of being flattened

out. The upper left-hand portions of the figures 1 and 7 have the inclined sides, as shown. The lower portion of the figure 2 has the inclined side upon the right, as shown. The upper portion of the figure 5 has the inclined side upon the right, as shown.

In the lower-case the design is preserved, the upper portion of the b, d, h, i, j, k, l, m, n, p, r, and u being extended beyond the up-and-down portions of the letter, and concaved, as shown. The lower portions of the v and w are concaved upon the right, as shown.

Having now described my design, what I claim as new is—

The design for a font of printing-type substantially as shown and described.
