## DESIGN FOR A GROUP OF STATUARY.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,956, dated December 10, 1878; application filed November 14, 1878.

[Term of patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, John Rogers, of New Canaan, in the county of Fairfield and State of Connecticut, have originated and designed a Group of Statuary, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The group is composed of three persons and a horse, and is called "The Peddler at the Fair." The peddler is seated on his horse. He has partly turned toward his left, so as to face the man and girl standing on that side of his horse. His left hand rests on his horse, back of the saddle. His right arm rests on a box of jewelry and trinkets over the front of his saddle. He has a high hat on, with necklaces and jewelry hung around it. He has been trying to sell a necklace to the girl beside him,

and is watching the effect on the gentleman of the girl's entreaty to buy it. She holds it up in her right hand for him to see, and has her left hand on his shoulder, and is looking up in his face, while he stands partly turned from her, and is sulkily moving his right hand toward his pocket.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a group of statuary, representing a peddler at the fair, consisting of the peddler on horseback, with his box of jewelry before him, and a man and girl beside him, to whom he is apparently trying to sell jewelry, substantially as shown in the accompanying illustrations.
