

DESIGN FOR WOVEN FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,962, dated December 10, 1878; application filed November 23, 1878. [Term of patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD THOMAS WERE, of Randalstown, in the county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented and produced a new and original Design or Pattern for Woven Fabrics, such as towels and other similar articles; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full and clear description of said design, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration thereof, forming a part of this specification.

The design consists in forming a series of broken diamonds by the arrangement of the short bars a a, formed by raised threads, so that each bar is crossed at one end by another, while the other end terminates in an open space, all of which will more fully appear by the photographic illustration of a portion of such woven fabric annexed hereto.

What I claim as my invention, and desire

to secure by Letters Patent, is—
The design for woven fabrics, substantially as shown in the accompanying photographic illustration.
