DESIGN FOR WOVEN BORDERS FOR TOWELS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,963**, dated December 10, 1878; application filed November 23, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD THOMAS WEBB, of Randalstown, in the county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented and produced a new and original Design or Pattern for Woven Borders for the Ends of Towels or other like articles; and I do hereby declare the following to be a full and clear description of said design, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration thereof, forming a part of this specification.

The design consists in a central row of stars, A, inclosed between two rows of diamond-shaped points, B B, projecting from raised strips or bands C C, on the outside of each of which there is also a row of fancy points or figures, as shown at D D, and a finishing checkered line. Outside of this is a plain space, which

may be inclosed by the double checkered lines E E, if desired, in order to give greater finish.

The design may be woven in different colors on a white or other colored ground, or it may be entirely of one color.

The pattern of the body of the towel or other like article on which this border is used is immaterial.

What I claim as my invention or production, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for woven border, substantially as shown by the annexed photographic illustration.
