

DESIGN FOR WOVEN FABRICS.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,964**, dated December 10,1878; application filed November 23, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, RICHARD THOMAS WEBB, of Randalstown, in the county of Antrim, Ireland, have invented and produced a new and original Design or Pattern for Woven Fabrics, such as towels and other like articles; and I hereby declare that the following is a full and clear description of the said design, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration thereof, forming a part of this specification.

The design consists of rows of squares of diamonds A, having intervening finely-checkered spaces, separated by raised lines B, extending from the corners of the squares or diamonds in one row to the corners of those of the next row.

The configuration of the checkered portion and of the squares or diamonds and the connecting-lines is produced by raised threads, and the fabric may be of any desired color.

The squares or diamonds A are raised in the center, as shown at a a.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for woven fabrics, substantially as shown by the annexed photographic illustration.
