

DESIGN FOR CIGAR-BOXES.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,968, dated December 17, 1878; application filed December 2, 1878.

[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LEOPOLD SIMONS, of New York city, in the county of New York and State of New York, have originated and invented a new and useful Design for Cigar-Boxes; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, forming a part of this specification.

A represents a section of a cigar-box, the exterior configuration of which is similar to that of a cigar, or cigar form. B represents the interior of figure or section A, and is semi-cylindrical in form and shape. C represents, in the parabola of the figure, a rectangular cavity, or a match-safe. D represents a

similar section to A, having equal lines exteriorly, and is of like semi-cylindrical form interiorly, both sections A and D being concave.

The whole is suitable for the packing and transportation of cigars, and the convenience of a match-safe for personal use.

What I claim as my invention is-

The design for a cigar-box, as herein described, and shown by the accompanying photograph.
