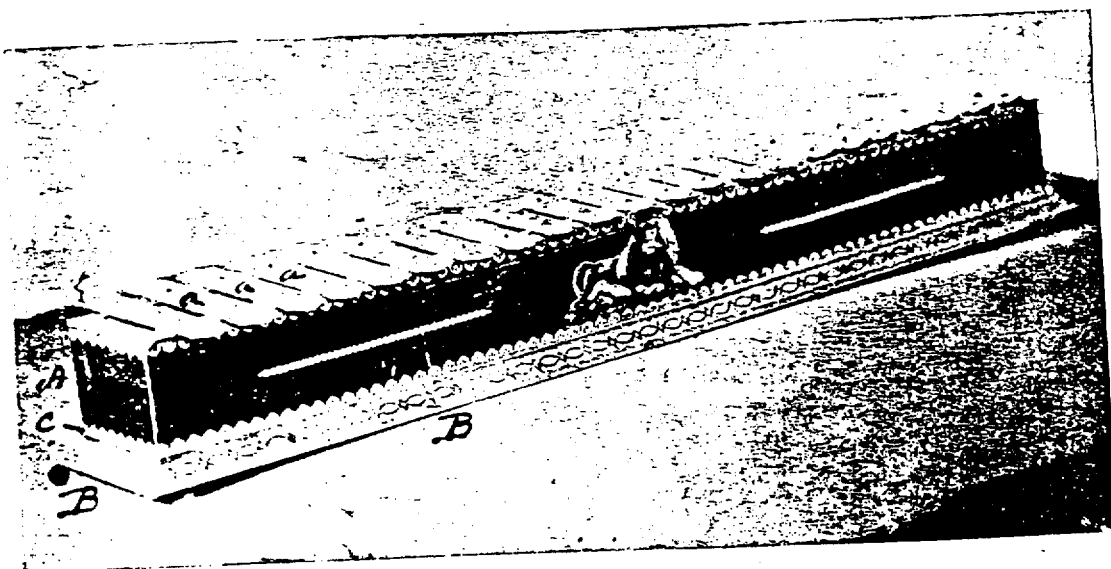

CADWALLADER M. RAYMOND, OF BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS.

DESIGN FOR A METALLOPHONE.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,972**, dated December 17, 1878; application filed October 25, 1878.
[Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CADWALLADER M. RAYMOND, of Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have originated a new Design for Metallophones, of which the following is a specification:

In the accompanying representation of my design, A designates the body of a metallophone, supporting the metal plates or flat bars *a a*. B represents a base or stand, upon which the body of the metallophone is supported. The base B consists of an ornamental molding, *b*, on the upper part of which is a scalloped edge or border, *c*.

The base B may be made of metal or wood, and is designed to be finished in gilt; but it may be painted in any color to suit the fancy.

At the center of the side of the body of the instrument is the representation of a lion, as shown.

What I claim as my invention is—

The design for a metallophone consisting of the molding band and border *c* upon the base of the body A, substantially as described, and shown in the accompanying illustration.
