

DESIGN FOR RUG-PATTERN.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,975, dated January 7, 1879; application filed November 5, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern :

Beit known that I, ALVIN GIBBS, of Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have originated and designed a Pattern for Rugs, Mats, or other fabrics, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification.

The border consists of parallel stripes of equal widths and different lengths, arranged so as to form the indented inner edge of the border and the indented shaped spaces or figures in the corners and along the middle of the

border, as shown.

The center consists of the portion of a side of a room and carpeted floor, and the representation of a cat lying on the carpet, as shown. Suitable colors should be employed to produce a harmonious effect.

What I claim as my invention is—

A design for a rug or mat, in which the border is composed of stripes, and the center of a cat lying on a carpet, substantially as described and shown.
