

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,978, dated January 7, 1879; application filed December 7, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Cornelius Jackson, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification:
My design is shown in the accompanying

photographic illustration.

The groundwork a of the design is of open net-work, and on this ground are arranged puffed or raised stripes b, the continuity of each of which is interrupted at intervals by flattened rings or circles d.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim —

The design for a knitted fabric, said design comprising the groundwork a, with puffed or raised stripes b, having flattened rings or circles d, all substantially as shown and described.
