

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,979**, dated January 7, 1879; application filed December 7, 1878. [Term of patent 3½ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CORNELIUS JACKSON, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for Knitted Fabrie, of which the following is a specification:

My design is shown in the accompanying

photographic illustration.

The design comprises alternating portions a and b, the portion a being plain, and the portion b having a groundwork of a somewhat more loosely-knitted character than the portion a, which groundwork is crossed at intervals by puffed or raised stripes d.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim—

The design for a knitted fabric, said design comprising the plain portions a and striped portions b, all substantially as shown and described.
