

DESIGN FOR KNITTED FABRIC.

Specification forming part of Design No. 10,980, dated January 7, 1879; application filed December 7, 1878. [Term of patent 31 years.]

To all whom it may concern:
Be it known that I, HENRY A. TRUITT, of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have invented a new and original Design for a Knitted Fabric, of which the following is a specification:

My design is shown in the accompanying

photographic illustration.

The design comprises stripes a and intervening open-work fabric b. The main feature of each stripe a is a series of parallel cords, and the intervening fabric b consists of ordinary net-work, drawn together at certain points, so as to form openings d.

Irrespective of the colors employed, I claim— The design for a knitted fabric, said design comprising the stripes a and intervening openwork fabric b, all substantially as shown and described.
