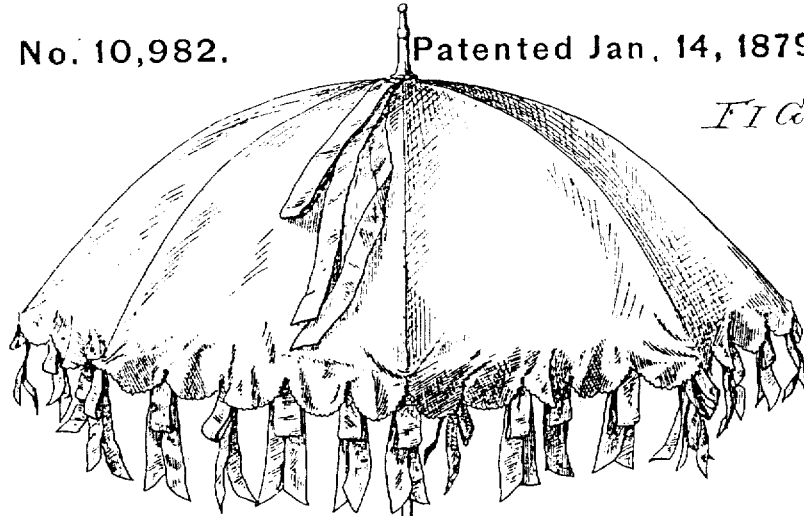

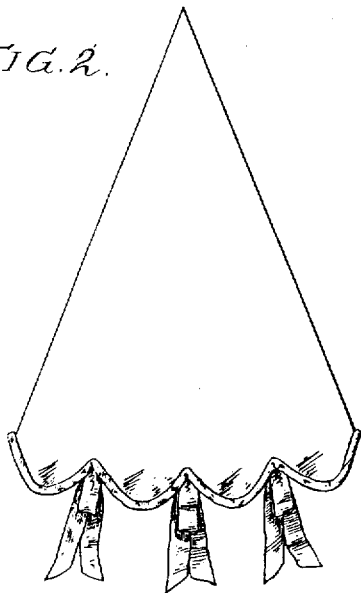
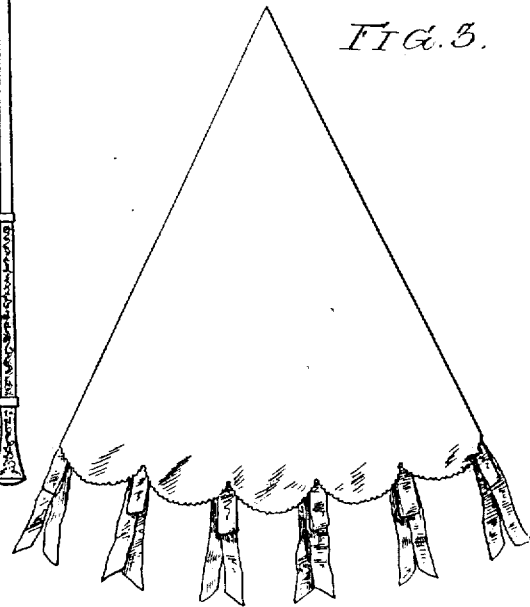

DESIGN FOR A PARASOL.

Specification forming part of Design No. **10,982**, dated January 14, 1879; application filed March 11, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{2}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM A. DROWN, Jr., of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, have produced or invented a new and original Design for a Parasol, of which the following is a specification:

My design is fully shown in the accompanying drawing, in which Figure 1 is a view of a complete parasol, and Figs. 2 and 3 views of sections of a parasol-cover embodying my design, which consists in scalloping the edge of the cover and providing said scalloped edge with bows of ribbon having pendent ends.

I have shown in the drawing as many bows of ribbon as there are scallops in the edge of the cover; but the number of bows need not necessarily be the same as the number of scallops. Neither is it material whether the edges

of the scallops are bound, as shown in Fig. 2, or "pinked," as shown in Fig. 3, the general appearance of the parasol not being affected by such slight changes in the details of the design.

I claim—

The design for a parasol, consisting of the scalloped edge upon the cover and the bows of ribbon having pendent ends, all substantially as described, and as shown in and by the accompanying drawing.
