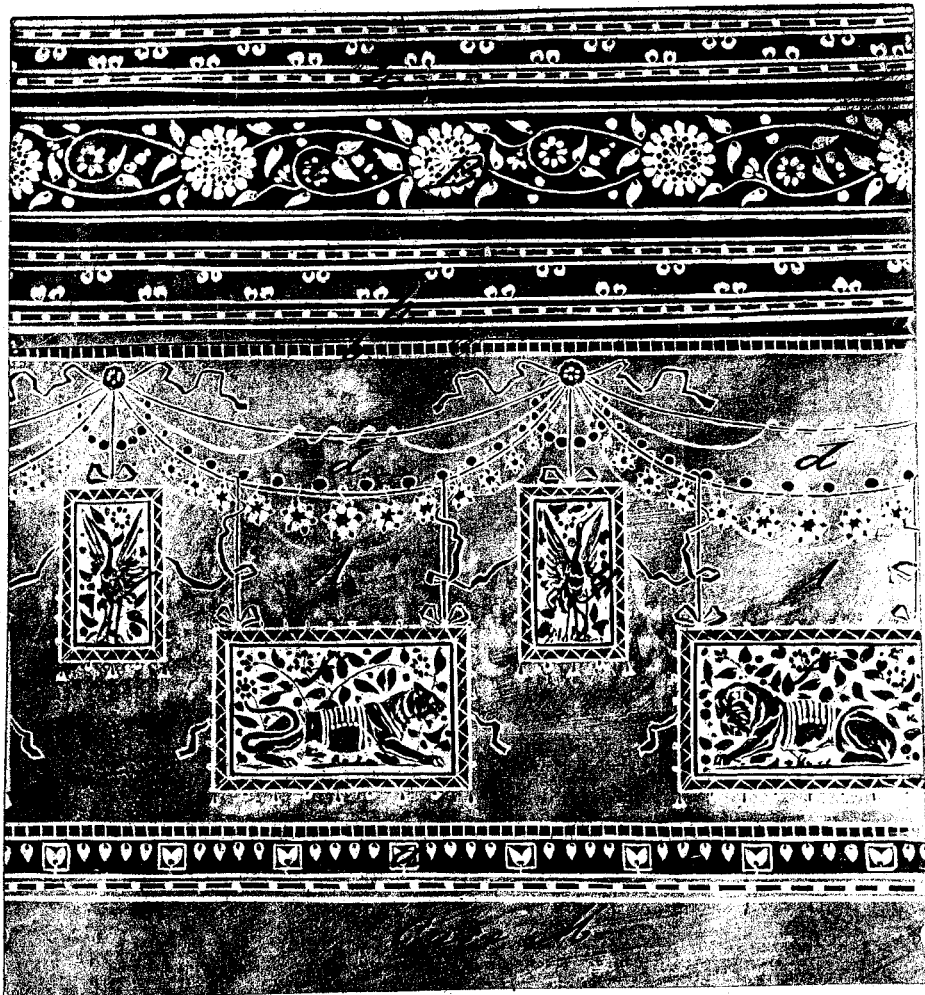

DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

Specification forming part of Design No. **11,001**, dated January 28, 1879; application filed December 23, 1878.
[Term of patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHRISTIAN HERTER, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Wall-Paper, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, making part of this specification, and which fully represents my invention.

This invention relates to an ornamental border for wall-papers; and consists of a larger portion, A, which is bounded by ornamental bands *a* and *b*, and of a narrower portion, B. In the larger portion A are arranged ribbons and festoons *d*, which are suspended from rosettes *c*, near the upper band, *b*. From the middle part of the festoons *d* are suspended, by ribbons, oblong frames *f*, which are provided with ornamental borders and interior decorations formed of conventional animals and plants. Intermediately between the oblong panels *f* are suspended, directly from the rosettes, the narrower oblong panels *g*, which are formed of similar ornamental borders and interior conventional fillings. The narrower portion B is composed of two outer bands, *h*, having interior alternating spurs or

beads, facing each other, and of a wider band, *i*, which is bounded by parallel lines at each side, and on which are arranged, at suitable intervals, rosette-shaped conventional flowers, which are connected, by undulating vines and shoots, with smaller flowers, leaves, and buds.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

1. The design for a wall-paper border, consisting of suspended festoons and of oblong frames, which are provided with ornamental fillings, and suspended alternately from the middle portion and ends of the festoons, as shown and described.

2. The design for a wall-paper border, consisting of exterior ornamental bands, and of an interior band provided with rosette-shaped flowers and conventional connecting vines, as shown and described.
